

How to Use I MAPS

- The map opens to Wake County. You will need to zoom in to Garner to be able to see the property lines.
- **To navigate** around the map, use horizontal the tool bar at the top. Click on the tool you want, and then you will need to click on the map to use the tool.
 - The + **Magnifying Glass** to zoom in closer
 - The - **Magnifying Glass** to zoom out
 - The **White Hand** to pan and move around: left, right, up, and down
 - The **White Arrow** to select a parcel to pull up the property information on the right side of the screen; you will need to click on the white arrow select tool first and then click on a parcel so that its boundary turns red
- Use the **Property Search** window on the right side of the screen to find a property by address, owner, real estate ID#, or parcel PIN#. The “Search By” is one of several a drop-down options.
- **To display other layers**, look at the bottom right of the screen in the green box, click “Show Additional Layers on Map.” Use the vertical bar at the right to scroll up and down to see all the layers that can be displayed.
 - The property lines are displayed automatically by default
 - The other layers are turned off and need to be checked to turn on
 - Some layers are grouped in a category , and you have to check the category box to display (example: Entertainment, Museums, Shopping Centers, and Sports Facilities and grouped into the category Cultural Centers, and this box would need to be checked to display)
- To display **aerial photography**, look at the top of the screen to the right under the header “Disclaimers” at the box that has “Street, Aerial, Blend.”
 - Click “Aerial”
 - Click “Street” to turn the aerial photos off
- To pull up a **property deed document**, do the following.
 - Zoom in to the property you want to pull up the deed document
 - With the **white arrow** tool, select the parcel so that its boundary turns red
 - At the bottom right of the screen, there is a green box, and just above this box is a row of horizontal icons
 - To the left of the green \$ icon, there is a book icon, and click this
 - Above this in the top white box, click “**View**” under the heading Deed to open the deed directly from the Wake County Register of Deeds
